PRODUCTION PROCEDURES

Antiserum was cross adsorbed using bovine, chicken, goat, human, mouse, rat and sheep immunosorbents to remove cross reactive antibodies. The antibody to rabbit IgG was isolated by affinity chromatography using antigen coupled to agarose beads. F(ab')2 fragments were generated using a pepsin digestion. Fc fragments and whole IgG molecules have been removed. Fragments were conjugated to R-phycoerythrin (RPE).

Antibody concentration was determined by extinction coefficient: absorbance at 280 nm of

1.4 equals 1.0 mg of IgG.

By immunoelectrophoresis and ELISA this antibody reacts specifically with rabbit IgG and with light chains common to other rabbit immunoglobulins. No antibody was detected against non-immunoglobulin serum proteins. Less than 1% cross reactivity to bovine, chicken, goat, human, mouse, rat and sheep IgG was detected. This antibody may cross

react with IgG from other species.

APPLICATIONS Centrifuge tube to remove product from lid. Optimal working dilutions should be determined

experimentally by the investigator. Prepare working dilution immediately before use.
