PRODUCTION PROCEDURES	<p>The antibody was isolated by affinity chromatography using antigen coupled to agarose beads.</p> <p>Antibody concentration was determined by extinction coefficient prior to conjugation: absorbance at 280 nm of 1.4 equals 1.0 mg of IgG.</p> <p>By immunoelectrophoresis and ELISA this antibody reacts specifically with Alligator IgG and with light chains common to other Alligator immunoglobulins. No antibody was detected against non-immunoglobulin serum proteins.</p> <p>This antibody may cross react with IgG from other species.</p>								
APPLICATIONS	<p>Centrifuge tube to remove product from lid. Optimal working dilutions should be determined experimentally by the investigator.
