PRODUCTION PROCEDURES

Antiserum was cross adsorbed using bovine, chicken, goat, horse, human, mouse, rat & sheep immunosorbents to remove cross reactive antibodies. The antibody to guinea pig IgG was isolated by affinity chromatography using antigen coupled to agarose beads and conjugated to horseradish peroxidase (HRP).

Antibody concentration was determined by extinction coefficient: absorbance at 280 nm of

1.4 equals 1.0 mg of IgG.

By immunoelectrophoresis and ELISA this antibody reacts specifically with guinea pig IgG and with light chains common to other guinea pig immunoglobulins. No antibody was detected against non-immunoglobulin serum proteins. Less than 1% cross reactivity to bovine, chicken, goat, horse, human, mouse, rat & sheep IgG was detected. This antibody

may cross react with IgG from other species.

**APPLICATIONS** Centrifuge tube to remove product from lid. Optimal working dilutions should be determined

experimentally by the investigator. Prepare working dilution immediately before use.
